## ..invite 16 young people from around the world to: Summercamp: Discover Striking North East Netherlands 2022

We want to provide you with special experiences and insights about this part of the Netherlands. The area is green with forest and heathland, is crossed by rivers and bordered by sea and beach. It is relatively quiet and offers the opportunity to be active as well as to relax.

During the two weeks that you spend with us, you will become acquainted with the theme of sustainability, you will visit some tourist highlights and you have been active. Both on land and on (and perhaps in) the water. And above all, you have met new international friends.

In order to participate in the camp, you must be open to many different activities, which call on both your brain and your physique. It is expected that you are in reasonable physical condition, that you can cycle and swim.

## Information about the camp

Date:	arrival Saturday June 18, 2022, departure Saturday July 2, 2022
Participants:	16 young people, 8 boys and 8 girls, from different countries. Age: 17-20 years.
Arrival and departure:	Participants are picked up / brought from Schiphol Airport. Plan your trip so that arrival on Saturday 18-6 is between 10:00 and 14:00 and your departure on Saturday 2-7 between 11:00 and 15:00. Pick up from and drop off to international trains around the same time slots is of course also possible in consultation.
Global program:	The first two days you will stay in safari tents (separate tents for boys and girls) on the edge of a nature reserve: Archery, bushcraft, campfire, cooking together. After that you will stay for a number of days in succession with 3 different host families at the 3 Rotary clubs. There you experience daily life on site









and you get to know the area. There is room to explore and relax alone or with a group. But many joint activities are also planned. We visit programs on the theme of sustainability at Wageningen University and an impressive water project that has been set up to compensate for climate change. You also stroll through the most beautiful heath and forest area in the Netherlands and visit the world-famous Kröller-Müller museum. Of course, a visit to Amsterdam and Giethoorn is not lacking. In Winschoten, where this camp is closed, you can enjoy water sports and visit wide sandy beaches on the Wadden Sea. Then all that remains is a memorable closing evening and a head and heart full of beautiful memories.

Costs: you have to pay your own contribution of €.300,- after placement and before arrival. You have to take care of your travel costs to the Netherlands, pocket money and your insurance yourself. Accommodation, food and transport within the Netherlands are arranged by the Rotary Clubs.

Insurance: Rotary takes out basic insurance that covers costs for damage, accidents and medical expenses during your stay. (see: <u>http://yep-</u> <u>insurance-rotary</u>). You must take out additional insurance yourself.

Stay: as indicated under 'global program', the first two days of the stay will be camped in safari tents: large tents with bunk beds and wooden floors. The other days at 3 different host families.

Language and food: official language is English. The meals are European, always with the option for vegetarian.

What to bring: in addition to 'casual wear', it is recommended to bring swimwear and good light walking shoes.

Application: follow the procedure as specified on your national Rotary website page. Register before April 1. We will match the options as soon as possible so that you will hear quickly whether you have been placed for this camp.
